The Lesson: 1 Corinthians 12:1-11

Now concerning spiritual gifts, brothers and sisters, I do not want you to be uninformed. You know that when you were pagans, you were enticed and led astray to idols that could not speak. Therefore I want you to understand that no one speaking by the Spirit of God ever says "Let Jesus be cursed!" and no one can say "Jesus is Lord" except by the Holy Spirit. Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of services, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. To one is given through the Spirit the utterance of wisdom, and to another the utterance of knowledge according to the same Spirit, to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit, to another the working of miracles, to another prophecy, to another the discernment of spirits, to another various kinds of tongues, to another the interpretation of tongues. All these are activated by one and the same Spirit, who allots to each one individually just as the Spirit chooses.

Presider The Holy Gospel of our Lord, Jesus Christ according to John

People Glory to you, Lord Christ.

The Gospel: John 2:1-11

On the third day there was a wedding in Cana of Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples had also been invited to the wedding. When the wine gave out, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine." And Jesus said to her, "Woman, what concern is that to you and to me? My hour has not yet come." His mother said to the servants, "Do whatever he tells you." Now standing there were six stone water jars for the Jewish rites of purification, each holding twenty or thirty gallons. Jesus said to them, "Fill the jars with water." And they filled them up to the brim. He said to them, "Now draw some out, and take it to the chief steward." So they took it. When the steward tasted the water that had become wine, and did not know where it came from (though the servants who had drawn the water knew), the steward called the bridegroom and said to him, "Everyone serves the good wine first, and then the inferior wine after the guests have become drunk. But you have kept the good wine until now." Jesus did this, the first of his signs, in Cana of Galilee, and revealed his glory; and his disciples believed in him.

Affirmation of Faith

Let us declare our faith in God.

All: We believe in God the Creator, infinite in wisdom, mercy and love, from whom every family in heaven and on earth is named. We believe in Jesus Christ, Son of God and Son of man, the gift of God's unfailing grace, the ground of our hope, and the promise of our deliverance from sin and death. We believe in God the Holy Spirit, the divine presence in our lives, who sustains and strengthens us, especially in our time of need. We believe in one God: Creator, Christ and Holy Spirit, and that our faith should manifest itself in the service of love as set forth in the example of our blessed Savior, that the realm of God may come upon the earth. Amen.

Litany in the Words of Martin Luther King, Jr.

Leader: Let us before all else give thanks for the love of God revealed to the world in the life and death of Jesus Christ:

MLK: The Cross is the eternal expression of the length to which God will go in order to restore broken community.

People: Lord, hear our prayer.

Leader: Let us give thanks for the legacy of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., and for the enduring power of his dream:

MLK: I have a dream that one day every valley shall be exalted, every hill and mountain shall be made low ... and the glory of the Lord shall be revealed, and all flesh shall see it together. ... With this faith we will be able to work together, to pray together, to struggle together, to stand up for freedom together, knowing that we will be free one day.

People: Lord, hear our prayer.

Leader: Let us commit ourselves to pray and work for peace:

MLK: One day we must come to see that peace is not merely a distant goal that we seek, but a means by which we arrive at that goal. ... How much longer must we play at deadly war games before we heed the plaintive pleas of the unnumbered dead and maimed of past wars?

People: Lord, hear our prayer.

Leader: Let us commit ourselves to walk in the way of nonviolence:

MLK: The non-violent approach ... first does something to the hearts and souls of those committed to it. It gives them new self-respect; it calls up resources of strength and courage that they did not know they had. Finally, it reaches the opponent and so stirs his conscience that reconciliation becomes a reality.

People: Lord, hear our prayer.

Leader: Let us commit ourselves to pray and work for a just ordering of our world: **MLK:** Every step toward the goal of justice requires sacrifice, suffering and struggle; the tireless exertions and passionate concern of dedicated individuals. ... This is no time for apathy or complacency. This is the time for vigorous and positive action.

People: Lord, hear our prayer.

Leader: Let us commit ourselves to the vision of a world without poverty and disease: **MLK:** I have the audacity to believe that peoples everywhere can have three meals a day for their bodies, education and culture for their minds, and dignity, equality, and freedom for their spirits.

People: Lord, hear our prayer.

Leader: Let us commit ourselves to seek the spiritual renewal of our nation:

MLK: A nation that continues year after year to spend more money on military defense

 $than\ on\ programs\ of\ social\ uplift\ is\ approaching\ spiritual\ death.$

People: Lord, hear our prayer.

Leader: Let us commit ourselves to seek the spiritual renewal of the Church:

MLK: In spite of being disappointed, in spite of being left out without any initial response, millions of people are still knocking on the door of the Church and turning to it for the answers to the basic problems of life. The great challenge facing the Church today is to keep the bread fresh.

People: Lord, hear our prayer.

The Presider offers this concluding collect.

Concluding Collect: And now unto God who is able to keep us from falling and lift us from the dark valley of despair to the mountains of hope, from the midnight of desperation to the daybreak of joy, to God be power and authority, for ever and ever.
